November begins with All Saints Day on November 1st, a day dedicated to the Saints of the church who have attained heaven. You may want to ask your Assembly Friar to lead the members in the Litany of the Saints at your Nov. meeting.

On the eve of All Saints Day, Fr. Michael J McGivney, was beatified and declared "Blessed" in a Mass and Beatification Ceremony at the Cathedral of St. Joseph on October 31st, 2020, moving him one step closer to being a Saint. The Canonization cause for Blessed McGivney will require the confirmation of another miracle by the Vatican Congregation for the cause of Saints. Please pray the Father McGivney payer for his Canonization at your assembly meetings.

November 2nd is All Souls Day, a day to honor and pray for all the dead. Assemblies are encouraged to hold a memorial service for all deceased brothers in the month of November. A sample memorial service can be found on the Fourth Degree Website – www.sask4th.ca

Assemblies are also asked to participate in Remembrance Day ceremonies to honor our veterans. Assemblies can lay a wreath and be part of the color party in fourth degree uniform.

Below is a condensed list of program ideas for assemblies to conduct. More details on each program are available on the Fourth Degree Website www.sask4th.ca under the topic "Fourth Degree Program Manual."

- 1. Knights of Columbus Catholic Citizenship Essay Contest- order kit from supplies online.
- 2. Invite a panel of community members to speak about the history of your community and historical sites in the community.
- 3. Write letters to your MP about matters which are important to the Assembly.
- 4. Invite municipal representatives to speak about their roles or about Patriotic matters which are important to the Assembly.
- 5. Get out the Vote: send information to all knights about the importance to cast their vote and about what Catholics should consider in Candidates positions.
- 6. Donate a Chalice, Paten, Ciborium or a Communion Host Bowl, in memory of a deceased member, to a parish in need.
- 7. Knights of Columbus float in a community event parade or Canada Day parade.
- 8. Display the Canadian flag at all assembly meetings and knights of Columbus functions.
- 9. Participate in patriotic holidays- Victoria Day, Canada Day and Remembrance Day.
- 10. Veterans assistance- partnering with the legion
- 11. Publish a tour book or history book of religious and/or historical landmarks in your area.
- 12. Distribute flags on Canada Day that can be attached to antennas of vehicles.

- 13. Establish a heritage committee for your assembly history.
- 14. Present flags to your parish or school just before Canada Day.
- 15. Fourth Degree Scholarship
- 16. Sponsor a Mass of Thanksgiving
- 17. Sponsor a Memorial Church Service in honor of deceased knights and parishioners.
- 18. Fourth Degree Birthday, Sympathy, Get well, Anniversary, Thank you, and Congratulations greeting cards to Knights and parishioners.
- 19. Recognition Certificates to recognize the efforts of knights or parishioners
- 20. Patriotic Service Award Certificates to members of the community for outstanding achievements like retirements or recognition of years of service.
- 21. Honor Guard for deceased members
- 22. Color Corps for church and community special events
- 23. Recognize your Friar with a certificate and supper out.
- 24. Grotto Project for Mary, the Patroness of the Knights of Columbus
- 25. Donations to the Military Seminarian Fund and to the Knights of Columbus Charitable Vocations Endowment Campaign

A Guide to Fourth Degree Membership Recruitment



How to Use This Guide

This flyer is your guide to organizing and implementing a successful membership program in your assembly.

The suggestions presented here are proven winners.
You should decide which offer the best

This flyer provides an easy-to-implement approach to recruiting new Sir Knights. If you follow all the steps described, you should enjoy success.

Review the programs outlined in this guide and take the steps to get organized. Choose the programs that will work best for your assembly and schedule them during the fraternal year.

If you have discovered other ideas that work for your assembly, send them to the supreme master, so that we will be able to share them with other assemblies that might benefit from your experience.

Organize Your Membership Committee and Set Your Goals

The first and perhaps most important step in setting up a successful membership program in your assembly is organization.

- Appoint a Sir Knight to coordinate and oversee all membership programs and activities for the assembly.
- Appoint additional Sir Knights to serve on committee for promoting membership growth.

- Obtain dates for scheduled exemplifications from the master, to set goals and plan specific recruitment promotions and activities.
- Identify and schedule recruitment methods that best suit assembly's needs and goals – council drives, open houses, invitation programs, team recruiting, etc.
- Assign a Sir Knight to each council that the assembly represents, to serve as liaison, to promote the activities of the assembly and membership in the Fourth Degree.
- Get the ENTIRE assembly involved. Those who don't recruit directly can assist by identifying prospective members.

Build a Prospect List

Before you consider HOW to recruit, you must address the question of WHOM to recruit. There are many eligible members who would enjoy participating in the patriotic programs and activities of the Fourth Degree. Identifying them is easier

- Acquire a roster of eligible members from the financial secretaries of the councils affiliated with the assembly
- Target all local priests who are members of the Order.
- Target veterans, policemen, and firemen who are members of the Order as prospects.
- Target fathers, sons, nephews, cousins, brothersin-law, fathers-in-law, grandparents, grandsons who are members of the Order.

 Advertise regularly in council bulletins, inviting qualified prospects to contact assembly membership committee about joining.

Use your imagination. New Sir Knights are all around you.

Conduct a Recruitment Invitation Program

The Fourth Degree Membership Recruitment Invitation is a tool for making initial contact with eligible prospects. It is effective when used in tandem with personal follow-up that stresses the patriotic aspect of membership in the Fourth Degree.

- Order a supply of Fourth Degree Membership Invitations (#2412) and envelopes from the Supreme Council Supply Department or create your own invitation.
- Send invitations personally signed by the faithful navigator, to prospective Sir Knights.
- Telephone the prospective Sir Knight within one week of mailing invitation, to arrange a home visit by assembly members.
- Review materials "A Call to Patriotism"flyer (#4135), assembly newsletter, etc.
- Inform the prospect and his wife of the date and program of the exemplification and explain all their financial obligations.
- Ask the prospective Sir Knight to JOIN the Fourth Degree.
- Answer any questions that prospective members or their wives may have.

 Follow through with attendance at the exemplification; and to future assembly meetings and programs.

Conduct an Open House at a Local Council

Before or after a council meeting is an ideal time to hold a Fourth Degree Open House to reach your audience of prospective Sir Knights. The success of your Open House is dependent on carefully planning and carrying out each of the following steps.

- Appoint a committee to organize, set the date and time of the event. Publicize in local council newelectors.
- Order quantities of these materials in advance— Membership Document (#4), the new Introductory to the Fourth Degree (# 4544) and the A Message for Knights who Want More (# 4135) flyers, and the "Take Your Membership to New Heights poster (#4136), from the Supreme Council Supply Department.
- Prepare table top displays highlighting assembly activities and Fourth Degree principles; include handouts and copies of assembly newsletter.
- Have Sir Knights in regalia on hand to describe the color corps and benefits of membership in the Fourth Degree.
- Schedule a question and answer session to further explain the assembly and the Fourth Degree.

Have pens on hand and assist prospects in

completing Membership Documents (#4).

Conclude with refreshments and a brief social.

Appoint a Fourth Degree Liaison to Local Councils

The only real source of new members that your assembly can draw from is that of the local councils. That is why it is imperative that your assembly is visible to those prospect Sir Knights in your area.

One way to make your assembly more visible is to appoint a Fourth Degree liaison, or representative within each local council assigned to the assembly. The liaison can answer any questions they may have during a meeting and encourage Third Degree members to join the Fourth Degree. Here are the steps to appointing a liaison:

- The faithful navigator should review the roster of each council and identify those members who are proven recruiters, sales oriented and who know the Fourth Degree quite well.
- Notify the local grand knight that the liaison will attend council meetings as a representative of the assembly, to update members: on assembly events, activities, Fourth Degree membership, future scheduled exemplification dates, and answer any questions.
- Be sure that the liaison has an ample supply of Fourth Degree promotional flyers and Membership Documents (#4).

Recruiting New Members to The Fourth Degree

Dear Brother Knights,

I received several inquiries from Sir Knights and some from prospective members who were thinking to join and asked about the criteria necessary to become Fourth Degree Members.

After the board of Directors approved the unified degree of Charity, Unity, and Fraternity, they amended the eligibility of membership in the Fourth Degree as follows:

Section 25. Eligibility for Membership.

- (a) Applications for membership in the Fourth Degree may be made to any Assembly provided the applicant is:
 - 1. (i) Over eighteen years of age.
 - 2. (ii) A citizen of the country in which he resides, or with permission of the Master of the District over the area where he claims citizenship, with the understanding that if permission is granted the pledge of allegiance will be to the country of citizenship.
 - 3. (iii) A Third Degree member in good standing in his council

The Administration of the Fourth Degree in each District is mandated to the Master of the District who answers to the Vice Supreme Master and Supreme Master.

As Master of the District of Saskatchewan, I offer you the following guidelines:

- 1. Proper procedures need to be followed by assemblies to recruit Fourth Degree Members.
 - The Assembly needs to work with the council to verify if the member is in good standing with the council and to determine his readiness to join the fourth degree.
 - The Assembly recruiting the new member needs to explain the responsibilities that are involved in becoming a fourth-degree member as well as to inform the member that he will be joining an assembly which will levy yearly dues to the member. The amount should be specified. Also, inform the prospect that joining the fourth degree involves a commitment to be involved in the assembly as well as in his council. The member needs to keep his dues current in both his council and his assembly to be in good standing in the assembly. The member should also be prepared to be involved and assist both the council and assembly in furthering the work of the Order.
 - Receiving the Stroke of knighthood does not mean that one is done. This is only the beginning of the journey. One needs to continue to be informed in his faith and in the work of the Order. The Order offers members great opportunities to become better Catholics, better citizens, better fathers and better husbands in the image of St. Joseph.
 - Members who come forward on their own should be given the opportunity to join. The Assembly should contact the member and discuss the criteria to join and determine readiness.

We are not to judge and set our own rules. We follow Supreme Guidelines.

- During each unified degree, Supreme has included that the new members be informed about the Fourth Degree and be told that they can advance to full Knighthood and receive the Stroke of Knighthood in the Fourth Degree when they are ready. Information about the Fourth degree can also be handed out to the new members.
- 2. Welcoming and Onboarding the New Members is a must: New members who join the Fourth Degree need to feel welcome, and should be mentored and invited to functions and meetings. Time spent on properly onboarding a new member will save the assembly time later on should the member become delinquent. Most delinquent members feel that they have nothing to contribute because they are not involved, not asked to assist in programs and are not welcomed and onboarded Properly.

Uniform Policy: Honour Guard, Color Corps Procedures

Uniform Policy:

On June 30th of 2019, the Cape and Chapeau Uniform was retired. Use of Cape and Chapeau in Honor or Color Corps is a direct violation of the Laws and Rules Governing the Fourth Degree.

Section 38 of the Laws and Rules Governing the Fourth Degree prescribes the official dress uniform of the 4th degree. *See photos below.

We expect that all members of the Color Corps or honour guards, as catholic gentlemen, will comply with this policy and support and promote the official uniform.

It is the responsibility of Faithful Navigators and Color Corps Commanders to instruct and direct your members that they are required to wear the new uniform if they wish to participate in honour guard or color corps activities. Any Faithful Navigator or Color Corps Commander who can not support this policy should contact the District Master.

Honor Guard/Color Corps Procedures

Below are some guidelines for assemblies when conducting honour guard or color corps activities in your parish.

- 1. We realize that not many Sir Knights have purchased the official uniform---we have about 30 in Sask. to date. We also realize that assemblies want to honour their deceased brothers, a visit by the bishop or special celebrations with an honour guard. Please use the guidelines below to guide your activities.
- 2. Only Sir Knights in the official uniform are allowed to participate in honour guard activities: processing in at the beginning of mass, lining the aisles, drawing swords, marching in colors, or any other color corps activities
- 3. Other Sir Knights can also participate, but separately from the official honour guard-they can walk in as a group dressed in Tuxedos or dark suits (including wearing their social baldrics) a few minutes before the opening procession and be seated together near the front of the church. They do not participate in any honour guard activities.
- 4. Some assemblies form an honour guard wearing their tuxedos and a yellow and white third-degree service baldric. This is fine as it is not a fourth-degree honour guard. It is a third-degree honour guard. Please ensure you do not wear the social baldric with the 3rd degree baldric.
- 5. No activities should be conducted by Fourth Degree Knights which promote the Fourth Degree Color Corps---example—forming an honour guard wearing a tuxedo and social or service baldric.
- 6. Check with the parish priest in regard to any color corps or honour guard activities and respect his decisions

Hope this answers some of your questions.

- 8. Display the Canadian Flag at your Assembly Meetings
- 9. Patriotic Service Certificates to community members to recognize outstanding community achievement like retirements or years of service.
- 10. Make a donation to the Military Chaplains' Fund. Send it to the K of C Sask. Charitable Foundation and specify "Military Chaplains' Fund and Assembly number.
- 11. Recognize your Assembly Friar with a supper outing and a certificate of appreciation
- 12. Assembly Christmas supper and social with a speaker afterwards
